So before you get all cynical about how long it takes, instead take seriously the message the the sheriff will do all he can

to expedite the process, and that he sees enough of a growing

threat in our county to advise us to learn to defend ourselves.

2. A ballot measure called Measure W will be voted on in March, and as is so often the case, it's bass-ackwards. If you vote yes, you are voting to rescind the new tax that we received a year or two ago. If you vote no, you are voting to retain the tax increase.


After hearing what the fire guys had to say, I would recommend that we give serious consideration to leaving the tax in place for the sake of our own safety and


